Assembly Bill 3, Special Session relates to providing production loans to be used for acquisition of fertilizer, seed, fuel, etc., necessary to plant or harvest a crop. The amendment would expand its scope to permit funds to be used for real estate taxes in general.

Senate Rule 50(7) reads as follows:

Senate amendment 3 would expand the scope of the bill. Therefore, it is the opinion of the chair that the amendment is not germane.

Ordered to a third reading.

By request of Senator Norquist, with unanimous consent, the bill was considered for final action at this time.
