A Proclamation

I, Anthony S. Earl, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Section 11 of Article IV and section 4 of Article V of the Constitution of Wisconsin, do amend as follows Executive Order 81, dated September 24, 1985, requiring the convening of a special session of the Legislature at the Capitol in Madison, beginning on September 24, 1985 at 10:00 A.M.:

1. Add a Paragraph 18 to read as follows: Exempting from certain registration requirements under certain conditions stock issues of corporations which are seasoned issuers.
