#### A Proclamation

- I, Anthony S. Earl, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Section 11 of Article IV and section 4 of Article V of the Constitution of Wisconsin, do require the convening of a special session of the Legislature at the Capitol in Madison, beginning on October 31, 1985 at 11:00 A.M. solely to consider and act upon the following specific legislative business:
  - 1. Exempting municipalities from civil liability arising from the consumption of alcohol beverages, exempting providers of alcohol beverages from civil liability arising from providing alcohol beverages to adults and imposing civil liability on providers of alcohol to underage persons, eliminating vicarious criminal liability for certain alcohol beverage law violations, making it an offense for an underage person to knowingly attempt to enter licensed premises, making it an offense for an underage person to knowingly attempt to enter licensed premises, making it an offense for an underage person to intentionally carry false documentation purporting to show the underage person has attained the legal drinking age and increasing the maximum forfeiture for violations by underage persons of certain alcohol beverage laws.
