To the Honorable, the Senate:

I have approved Senate Bill 546 as Wisconsin Act 296 and deposited it in the office of the Secretary of State.

I am vetoing Section 29 (5) of Senate Bill 546. Through this nonstatutory provision, the Department of Natural Resources is prohibited from issuing orders to municipalities to find new drinking water sources or to incur significant expense for water purification to eliminate radium in public water supplies which exceed federal standards. The DNR is also required to submit a

1987-89 biennial budget proposal exploring ways to fund municipal costs for locating new drinking water sources.

This nonstatutory provision significantly undermines the state's responsibility to maintain and improve public drinking water quality. Enactment of this language delays protection of public health from water supplies containing radium in excess of federal standards. In addition, this provision would threaten Wisconsin's authority to enforce federal environmental standards, a tradition which currently allows local control and flexibility to address local conditions.

The DNR has identified 51 communities that have drinking water which exceeds the federal standards for radium. Fifteen of these communities have already reduced their radium levels after reviewing alternatives with the DNR. The main objective of this amendment was to preclude the Department from ordering municipalities to make significant capital expenditures for radium reduction projects prior to January 1, 1988. In a separate correspondence from Secretary Besadny the DNR has committed that no orders which would result in significant expenditures will be made prior to this date. This veto will allow the Department to maintain its regulatory standards while continuing their emphasis on cooperating with communities with high radium levels in their drinking water.

By vetoing the nonstatutory provision we ensure that the health of Wisconsin residents is protected from radium in public water supplies and that Wisconsin, rather than the federal govrenment, will be able to continue to enforce federal environmental standards.
