RE: Legislative Review of an Order by which the Department of Natural Resources Proposes to Adopt Shoreland-Wetland Zoning Regulations for the City of LaCrosse.

The enclosed Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order, and Report to the Legislature, are submitted to you pursuant to sections 62.231 and 87.30, Wisconsin Statutes, which require the Department of Natural Resources to refer to each house of the Legislature, under section 227.19, Wisconsin Statutes, as affected by 1985 Wisconsin Act 182, any Order by which the Department proposes to adopt shoreland-wetland zoning regulations for a city.

The proposed Order was not submitted to the Legislative Council Rules Clearinghouse for review because the Order is, under the terms of section 87.30, Wisconsin Statutes, to be treated as an administrative rule only for the purpose of judicial review and review by standing committees of the Legislature, and not for any other purpose.

The Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA) requires each of Wisconsin's 17 Service Delivery Areas to publish, 120 days before the program begins, a proposed plan or a summary of such a plan for both Title IIA (year-round) and Title IIB (summer) programs.

These proposed plans or summaries are to be made available to each house of the State Legislature for review and comment. We instructed each SDA to submit these materials directly to us by March 3, 1986 for Title IIA. We, in turn, have agreed to package materials from all SDAs and transmit them to you on their behalf.

To the Honorable, the Senate:

I have approved Senate Bill 318 as Wisconsin Act 297 and deposited it in the office of the Secretary of State.

I have vetoed Section 74(3) which requires the Public Service Commission to promulgate rules to implement partial deregulation.

Decisions relating to partial deregulation of telecommunications services should be made on a case-by-case basis. This veto will ensure the Public Service Commission maximum flexibility in addressing the issues in this area. The telecommunications industry is in a state of transition. A requirement for the Public Service Commission to adopt rules in this area could impede the flexibility required for the Commission to adapt its regulation on a timely basis to changes in the industry.

I am concerned about the removal of the sunset on the partial exemption of nonfacilities-based resellers from the gross revenue tax. The elimination of the sunset will have a future negative impact on revenue which must be recovered. It is my intention to reexamine the gross revenue tax in the 1987-89 biennial budget.
