The senate met.

The senate was called to order by Fred A. Risser, president of the senate.

A Proclamation

I, Anthony S. Earl, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Section 11 of Article IV and section 4 of Article V of the Constitution of Wisconsin, do require the convening of a special session of the Legislature at the Capitol in Madison, beginning on May 20, 1986 at 12:00 Noon solely to consider and act upon the following specific legislative business:

> 1. Raising the legal drinking age to age 21, permitting all persons who have attained the age of 19 before September 1, 1986 to legally purchase, possess and consume alcohol beverages, and limiting to 18 year-olds the application of the 0.0% blood alcohol level while driving.

> 2. Authorizing construction of an indoor athletic practice facility on the University of Wisconsin-Madison campus, describing and regulating the Camp Randall Memorial Park and providing an appropriation.

3. Increasing to \$105 million the aggregate principal amount of bonds and notes that the Wisconsin Housing and Economic Development Authority (WHEDA) may issue to finance its economic development activities, authorizing WHEDA to invest up to \$1 million of its reserve or sinking funds or moneys not immediately required in independent Wisconsin businesses employing fewer than 25 full-time employees and having gross sales of less than \$2.5 million annually, permitting economic development bond to be issued after June 30, 1986, including in the definition of economic development projects certain consumer retail, railroad and recycling facilities, eliminating the export development program.

4. Revising the laws governing the patients compensation fund, eliminating the patients compensation panels, creating a medical malpractice mediation system, revising the laws governing medical malpractice and health care provider professional discipline, providing for studies and making appropriations.

5. Increasing the penalties for the possession, manufacture or delivery of cocaine, providing a mandatory drug abuse assessment for those convicted of possession of cocaine, and revising provisions for civil forfeiture of the proceeds of trafficking in cocaine.

6. Establishing a new schedule of fees for the register in probate.

7. Amending the grant of certain submerged lands to the City of Milwaukee.

8. Permitting the Commissioner of Insurance to create mandatory risk sharing plans upon a finding that liability insurance is not readily available and the public interest requires it be made available, modifying the period of notice required for termination or nonrenewal of insurance policies, extending to certain agencies the coverage that may be provided by the Local Government Property Insurance Fund and amending the surplus requirements for insurers doing business in this state.

9. Eliminating the termination date of the federally funded folk arts coordinator position.

10. Modifying the terms of the merged attendance area aid and the intradistrict transfer integration aid to permit districts to receive intradistrict integration aid using the primary guarantee of their choice.

11. Permitting the department of health and social services to waive certain requirements for insurance for foster care parents and authorizing the department to pay certain claims for damages caused by children in foster care.

12. Authorizing increased staff for the secretary of state to provide expedited corporation and uniform commercial code filing services and telephone name reservation and providing program revenue appropriations.

13. Making certain changes relating to revocation of operating privileges and operation of vehicles, including motorboats, while intoxicated.

A Proclamation

I, Anthony S. Earl, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Section 11 of Article IV and section 4 of Article V of the Constitution of Wisconsin, amend in the following manner Executive Order 99, dated May 19, 1986, requiring the convening of a special session of the Legislature at the Capitol in Madison, beginning on May 20, 1986 at 12:00 Noon:

> 1. In Paragraph 1 of the order delete "18 yearolds" and replace with "those under age 19".

2. In Paragraph 3 of the order, replace the word "bond" with "bonds and notes" and before the last period, add "authorizing an increase in the total principal amount of agricultural production loans WHEDA may guarantee, requesting the legislative audit bureau to audit the small enterprise economic development program and making confidential certain WHEDA investment grant or loan information".

3. In Paragraph 5 of the order, replace every occurrence of "cocaine" with "cocaine and ecgonine".

4. In Paragraph 13 of the order, after "revocation" add "and suspension" and after "privileges" add "and issuance of occupational licenses".
