In 1985 Wisconsin Act 29, the Department of Revenue (DOR) received \$120,000 to contract for out-of-state audits. Section 3046(10) of the act required DOR to study the cost-effectiveness of its contracting and report the results to the presiding officers of each house of the Legislature on or before December 1, 1986.

As part of the reductions taken in 1985 Wisconsin Act 120, DOR eliminated the \$120,000 for the contracting, thus not even implementing the program. Our intention was also to include legislation which would delete the section 3046(10) reporting requirements in 1985 Wisconsin Act 29. However, through an oversight, legislation was not included which would delete the reporting requirement.

Since the program was never implemented and it was assumed the reporting requirement was deleted as part of Act 120, no report was prepared for the December 1, 1986 due date.

I apologized for the lateness of this response and submitted this letter as the report required under section 3046(10) of 1985 Wisconsin Act 29.

Section 3019 of 1985 Wisconsin Act 29 requires that the Secretary of the Department of Employment Relations (DER) begin correcting pay inequities based on gender or race in the state civil service system in the 1986-87 fiscal year. This section requires that the Secretary submit to your committee a detailed proposal describing how the classes are to be reassigned to new pay ranges and how pay equity adjustments should be made to employes' salaries before correction of pay inequities begins. This letter describes my proposed plan to correct pay inequities identified by the Governor's Task Force on Comparable Worth.

As you are aware, Governor's Executive Order 44 established a Task Force on Comparable Worth in January of 1984. This Task Force carried out a study of jobs in the classified service and the academic staff of the University of Wisconsin System from March of 1984 to January of 1986. The report of this Task Force was submitted to the Governor in March of 1986. A copy of this report is being provided to you with this letter. The Governor asked the Department of Employment

Relations to review the report and develop a plan to address the pay inequities identified in the report.
