Assembly Rule 94 (3) directs the reprinting of the rules of the Assembly in pamphlet form after the Assembly's adoption of any resolution changing the rules. Assembly Rule 94 (1) directs that, for such pamphlet printing, any references contained in the Assembly rules to "provisions of the constitution, statutes, joint rules or assembly rules" shall be revised to conform to the numbers then assigned to such provisions.

A new pamphlet of the Assembly rules, "as last amended by 1987 Assembly Resolution 2", has been sent to the contract printer and will be delivered in 1,500 copies.

In compliance with the directives of Assembly Rule 94 (1) and (3), the following cross-reference changes have been incorporated into the new pamphlet:

Assembly Rule 20 (intro.): from statute "227.018" to "227.19 (4) (b)".

Assembly Rule 33 (7): see Assembly Rule 15 (6). Assembly Rule 52 (1): from statute "73 (10)" to "73 (9)".

Assembly Rule 66 (1) (f): from statute "73 (7)" to "73 (6)".
