# Assembly Bill 125

# GOVERNOR'S VETO MESSAGE

February 13, 1987

To the Honorable Members of the Assembly:

I have approved Assembly Bill 50 as 1987 Wisconsin Act I and deposited it in the office of the Secretary of State. I have exercised the partial veto power in one instance: Section 1 as it amends s. 15.157(2), pertaining to the Secretary of the Department of Development, or the Secretary's designee, serving as the secretary of the tourism council. I am vetoing the clause which names the Secretary of the Department of Development as secretary of the Tourism Council, because I believe that the DOD Secretary should serve as the Chairperson of the Council. Provisions in the general budget bill, SB 100, will accomplish that purpose. Greater coordination and cooperation will be possible between the council and DOD with the DOD Secretary as Chairperson of the Council.
