EXECUTIVE COMMUNICATIONS

Executive Order Number 39A

I, Tommy G. Thompson, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Article IV, section 11 and Article V, section 4 of the Constitution of Wisconsin, do amend Executive Order #28 (dated 11/17/87), which required the convening of a special session of the Legislature at the Capitol in Madison on November 18, 1987 at 9:00 a.m., by adding to its business consideration and action upon the following specific legislative business:

1. To enact legislation relating to the Wisconsin retirement system, fixed retirement investment trusts and transferring funds, limiting property tax levies and state and local expenditures, and dispute settlement procedure in local government employment.
