EXECUTIVE COMMUNICATIONS

Executive Order Number 47

I, Tommy G. Thompson, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Article IV, section 11 and Article V, section 4 of the Constitution of Wisconsin do require the convening of a special session of the Legislature at the Capitol in Madison, beginning on Thursday, June 30, 1988 at 10:00 a.m. solely to consider and act upon the following specific legislative business:

1. To enact legislation relating to diversion of water for agricultural purposes.

- 2. To enact legislation relating to providing drought assistance loan guarantees and interest rate reductions on drought assistance loans and making an appropriation.
- 3. To enact legislation relating to information for farmers on drought relief and making an appropriation.

In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Wisconsin to be affixed. Done at the Capitol in the City of Madison this twenty-ninth day of June in the year one thousand nine hundred and eighty-eight.
