#### GOVERNOR'S VETO MESSAGE

September 1, 1989

To the Honorable Members of the Assembly:

I have approved Assembly Bill 233 as 1989 Act 46, and deposited it in the office of the Secretary of State. This piece of legislation establishes a Higher Education Bond program for the State of Wisconsin. This program provides an important means for parents and grandparents to make a tax-exempt investment for their children's and grandchildren's college education. For the first time the State of Wisconsin will sell its bonds to Wisconsin citizens with the interest exempt from both federal and state income tax for individuals. This legislation received overwhelming bipartisan support indicating the importance this legislation will have for meeting the problem of rising costs of college education.

I have exercised the partial veto power in three instances.

Section 8. In order for the bonds to be marketed widely to Wisconsin citizens, the sale of the bonds should be negotiated through underwriters. The language which attempts to do this in proposed s. 18.822 fails to clearly provide the authority to sell at negotiated sale most state general obligation bonds. I am removing the language in s. 18.822 (2). The remaining language will permit a college savings bond program with bonds other than general obligation bonds. I am asking the sponsors of

this legislation to introduce additional legislation which will also permit the issuance of general obligation bonds as higher education bonds.

Also in Section 8 is language in proposed s. 18.83 (2) which would add an administrative rule process to the early redemption authority of s. 18.83 (1). The state's debt, as authorized in the statutes and as authorized by the official actions of the building commission, constitutes a contract of a very special and binding nature, pledging the full faith and credit of the State of Wisconsin. That contract, which may include certain privileges and rights, like the early redemption option authorized in this section, should not be subject to the administrative rules process, which could imply to a bondholder that the bondholder's privileges and rights could be changed over time by such a process. The building commission is given ample authority, both in this section and elsewhere in Chapter 18 to administer the early redemption option authorized by the bill. I am vetoing the administrative rulemaking requirement imposed upon the Department of Administration.

Section 13. The nonstatutory provisions of this bill limit the amount of bonds that may be issued to not more than \$100,000,000 within 9 months after the effective date of the bill. The bill provides to sell zero coupon bonds. This amount of discount authority will permit the sale of approximately \$175,000,000 of higher education bonds at current interest levels. I believe that this restriction is not necessary and that the legislature has provided the appropriate restriction in Section 10. I am directing the staff of the building commission to prepare a college savings bond issue for sale at the earliest time consistent with the State's borrowing needs, probably early in 1990.
