Dear Tom:

Section 89 of the Wisconsin Act 413 of 1987 directs the Department of Health and Social Services, upon consultation with the Council on Pilot Projects for the Uninsured, to submit a progress report on the State Health Insurance Program pilots for distribution to the appropriate standing committees of each house of the Legislature.

The attached report describes the progress the Department has made in planning and implementing the State Health Insurance Program pilot projects. It briefly summarizes previous and current legislation, lists the Department's responsibilities for reporting, enumerates pilot implementation activities, and provides an update on the emergency and permanent rule processes.

There are three pilots to be implemented under the legislation. The "Non-Insuring Firm" pilot started in Outagamie County in February 1989. Pilot enrollment efforts, local office and Advisory Committee actions are detailed.

The report also describes the "Insuring Firm" pilot, scheduled for start-up in September 1989, and the "Alternative Health Care Coverage Pilot", scheduled for start-up in October 1989.

On January 1, 1990 the Department will submit a second progress report, describing the status of each pilot

project, the number of persons enrolled and the amount of funds expended for subsidies and administration.
