Dear Mr. Melvin:

In the 1989-91 biennial budget bill, the Department of Natural Resources was requested by the Legislature to prepare a report on alternative funding sources for the additional activities related to drinking water quality that are required by the federal government.

This report describes the need for program expansion, funding alternatives to support the expansion, and a revolving loan program to encourage water system improvements. The report concludes that a funding mechanism should be enacted to support the expansion of the public water supply program in the Department of Natural Resources.
