Dear Mr. Melvin:

Pursuant to the requirements of section 153.10(1), Wis. Stats., I am pleased to submit to the Assembly the third quarterly *Health Care Data Report*. Like earlier quarterly reports, this report includes data based on hospital inpatient discharges reported to the Office of Health Care Information (OHCI) by all operating general medical-surgical and specialty hospitals in Wisconsin for the third quarter of 1989 (*July - September 1989*).

This report fulfills the statutory requirement to report "in a manner that permits comparisons among hospitals...the charges for up to 100 health care services or diagnostic-related groups selected by the office." The report goes beyond the statutory requirements by presenting several analyses of the Wisconsin hospital picture by distribution of patient discharges based on age, sex, source of hospital reimbursement and length of stay. The average charges per patient discharged by diagnostic-related group (DRG) are also compared by health service area and by hospital volume group.

Printed copies of this report are available from the office. Please contact OHCI should any members of the Assembly or your staff have any questions. Our office stands ready to assist you in any way possible.

I am submitting the Department of Administration (DOA) recommendations on the Clean Water Fund program as required by Section 3001(In), Act 31, Laws of 1989. Please distribute these recommendations to the Legislature under s. 13.172(2), Stats. Statutory language to implement these recommendations is also attached.

The biennial budget bill asked the Department of Administration to develop a proposal with recommendations on the Clean Water Fund program size, funding level, interest rate subsidies, transition period loan interest rate, and use of revenue bonds to leverage other program dollars. The DOA proposal addresses these important Clean Water Fund policy issues.

The Department of Justice has completed its study of the crime victim and witness assistance program, as required under 1989 Wisconsin Act 31, sections 3034 (lcg) and (lcm). On January 4, 1990, I submitted an interim report regarding cost control and program restructuring issues, which Act 31 mandated by studied. Attached is the follow-up report referenced in that letter.

This report contains findings regarding cost control, as well as issues which the Legislature may wish to consider regarding the possible restructuring of the program. At this point it appears that a greater state role could help address issues of equity, service gaps and, to some extent, cost control. The Department intends to review alternatives in restructuring the victim/witness assistance program as it develops its 1991-93 biennial budget request.
