#### PETITIONS AND COMMUNICATIONS

State of Wisconsin Legislative Audit Bureau

June 7, 1989

To the Honorable the Legislature:

We have completed a financial and compliance audit of the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire's student financial assistance programs as required by federal regulations and as requested by the University of Wisconsin System. We also included the state grants in our awards testing for compliance with state statutes as requested by the Wisconsin Higher Educational Aids Board. Our audit period was July 1, 1986, through June 30, 1988

The first and second sections of our report contain the University's student financial assistance programs' financial statements and the related independent auditor's opinion. The third and fourth sections contain

the auditor's statement on internal control systems and statement on compliance, as well as our comments on internal control deficiencies and findings of noncompliance. The fifth section contains our comments on the status of the recommendations made during the prior audit conducted by University of Wisconsin-System Internal Audit and a federal follow-up audit.

Except for questioned costs of \$35,318 and minor compliance errors, we found University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire administered the student financial assistance programs as required by federal regulations and state statutes. The primary area of noncompliance with federal regulations was the charging of an employe's entire salary and fringe benefit costs to the College Work-Study Job Location and Development program while the employe only spent 25 percent of his work time on the program. The University had concluded that charging one employe's salary and fringe benefit costs would approximate the total of other reasonable costs which were not charged to the program.

We appreciate the courtesy and cooperation extended to us by the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire staff during our audit. The University's comments on individual audit findings are within the body of our report, and its overall response is the Appendix.
