A Proclamation

I, Tommy G. Thompson, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Article IV, Section 11 and Article V, section 4 of the Constitution of Wisconsin, do require the convening of a special session of the Legislature at the Capitol in Madison, beginning on Tuesday, October 10, 1989 at 10:00 A.M. solely to consider legislation regarding illicit drug use and alcohol abuse in the following subject areas:

1. Legislation relating to law enforcement and criminal justice initiatives.
2. Legislation relating to expansion of correctional facilities.
3. Legislation related to correctional programs targeted toward drug users.
4. Legislation related to various sanctions for drug-related abuses, including but not limited to restriction of driving privileges, and confiscation of assets.
5. Legislation related to treatment of drug and alcohol users and prevention of drug and alcohol abuse.
6. Legislation related to expansion of media/education efforts and community involvement/assistance efforts.

In testimony whereof, I have set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Wisconsin to be affixed. Done at the Capitol in the City of Madison this twenty-ninth day of September in the year one thousand nine hundred and eighty-nine.
