1, Tommy G. Thompson, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Article IV, Section 11 and Article V, section 4 of the Constitution of Wisconsin, do amend Executive Orders #67 (dated 9/29/89) and #70 (dated 10/10/89), which required the convening of a special session of the Legislature at the Capitol in Madison, beginning on Tuesday, October 10, 1989 at 10:00 A.M., by adding to its business consideration and action upon the following specific legislative business:

To enact legislation relating to expanding the farmland tax credit to include improvements, increasing the maximum credit and making appropriations.
