A Proclamation

1. Tommy G. Thompson, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Article IV, Section 11 and Article V, section 4 of the Constitution of Wisconsin, do amend Executive Orders #67 (dated 9/29/89), #70 (dated 10/10/89) and #72 (dated 11/6/89), which required the convening of a special session of the Legislature at the Capitol in Madison, beginning on Tuesday, October 10, 1989 at 10:00 A.M., by adding to its business consideration and action upon the following specific legislative business:

1. To enact legislation to provide funding for vaccinations for measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR).
2. To enact legislation to ratify the agreement negotiated between the State of Wisconsin and the District 1199 with United Professionals for Quality Health Care for the 1989-91 biennium, covering employes in the professional patient care collective bargaining unit, and authorizing an expenditure of funds.

In testimony whereof, I have set my hand and caused the Great

Seal of the State of Wisconsin to be affixed. Done at the Capitol in the City of Madison this fifteenth day of December in the year one thousand nine hundred and eighty-nine.
