Relating to holding a juvenile in a secure detention facility; short-term detention for juveniles; permitting law enforcement officers to take truants into custody; extended juvenile court jurisdiction; waiver of juvenile court jurisdiction; juvenile court orders applicable to parents, guardians and legal custodians; prohibiting sheltering and concealing runaway children; the payment of restitution by juveniles who are placed in secured correctional facilities; providing short-term detention as a sanction for rule violations; proposing legislation related to confidential records; and providing a penalty.
