Legislative Audit Bureau

To the Honorable the Legislature:

We have completed a financial audit of the State of Wisconsin Unemployment Reserve Fund for the year ending June 30, 1989. The audit was requested by the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations and performed by the Legislative Audit Bureau to meet this request and as part of our audit responsibilities under s. 13.94. Wis. Stats.

The cash balance in the Reserve Fund increased \$323 million during the past fiscal year, and had an adjusted cash balance of over \$876 million on June 30, 1989. In accordance with s.108.18(3m), Wis. Stats., if the cash balance of the Reserve Fund is \$1 billion or more on June 30, the lowest tax rate schedule is implemented for tax contributions, the Reserve Fund management staff project that the cash balance could exceed \$1 billion on June 30, 1990.

Our audit report contains the auditor's unqualified opinion on the financial statements and related footnotes, and the supplemental information on the Fund's cash balance and related footnotes. We have included management recommendations in a separate letter issued to the Department. We appreciate the courtesy and cooperation extended to us by Department staff during the audit.
