A Proclamation

I, Tommy G. Thompson, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Article IV, Section 11 and Article V, section 4 of the Constitution of Wisconsin, do amend Executive Order #67 (dated 9/29/89), #70 (dated 10/10/89), #72 (dated 11/6/89), #77 (dated 12/15/89), #78 (dated 12/20/89) and #83 (dated 1/29/90) which required the convening of a special session of the Legislature at the Capitol in Madison on Tuesday, October 10, 1989 at 10:30 a.m., by adding to its business consideration and action upon the following specific legislative business:

1. To enact legislation relating to the substitution of judges.
2. To enact legislation relating to community-based efforts to prevent drug and alcohol abuse and making an appropriation.
3. To enact legislation relating to drug paraphernalia.
4. To enact legislation relating to providing debt service aid to school districts and making appropriations.
5. To enact legislation relating to the distribution of lottery proceeds, creating a lottery property tax relief credit, raising the rate of the one-time school property tax credit and making appropriations.
6. To enact legislation relating to creating a levy restraint payment to municipalities and counties and making appropriations.
7. To enact legislation relating to division of clean water fund powers and duties, making an appropriation and granting rule-making authority.
8. To enact legislation relating to comparative negligence, medical malpractice noneconomic damage awards, punitive damage awards, payments to persons who have obtained judgment in tort actions and making appropriations.
9. To enact legislation to various changes in the lobbying regulation law and code of ethics for state public officials and employees, responsibility for administration of the lobbying regulation law and granting rule-making authority and receipt of political

contributions in connection with certain fund-raising events.

10. To enact legislation relating to establishing a business improvement loan guarantee program; providing technical assistance and grants to municipalities and tribal governing bodies; development zones; a grant or loan to a manufacturing firm; funding agricultural research and development; tourism promotion; the Wisconsin job opportunity business subsidy program; conservation work projects for American Indian youth; grants to American Indian tribes for drug law enforcement activities; a loan to a bank holding company; spearfishing law enforcement aid and state agency costs for spearfishing; costs of legal services incurred by the department of justice; the authority of wardens of the department of natural resources; the American Indian economic liaison program; providing information and assistance by the department of administration to the American Indian community; grants for home school coordinators; granting rule-making authority; and making appropriations.

11. To enact legislation relating to law enforcement services provided during state mutual aid responses and making appropriations.

12. To enact legislation relating to holding a juvenile in a secure detention facility; short-term detention for juveniles; permitting law enforcement officers to take truants into custody; extended juvenile court jurisdiction; waiver of juvenile court jurisdiction; juvenile court orders applicable to parents, guardians and legal custodians; prohibiting sheltering and concealing runaway children; the payment of restitution by juveniles who are placed in secured correctional facilities; providing short-term detention as a sanction for rule violations; proposing legislation related to confidential records, and providing a penalty.

In testimony whereof, I have set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Wisconsin to be affixed. Done at the Capitol in the City of Madison this seventh day of March in the year one thousand nine hundred and ninety.
