We have completed an audit of the dental education contract between the State of Wisconsin and the Marquette University School of Dentistry for the 1987-89 biennium as required by s. 39.46, Wis. Stats. State funds paid to the Marquette School of Dentistry for tuition aids totaled \$1,445,962 for the biennium.

Our audit included tests to ensure that the Marquette University School of Dentistry has complied with contract requirements set forth in s. 39.46, Wis. Stats. This included reviewing hte residency certification and enrollment status of students claimed for tuition aids, the admissions preference given to Wisconsin residents, and the promotion of minority student access. We found that Marquette University was in compliance with s. 39.46, Wis. Stats., and the state funds were properly expended for the under graduate dental school program.
