To the Honorable the Legislature:

We have completed our financial and compliance audit of the student financial assistance programs at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, University of Wisconsin-Green Bay, and University of Wisconsin Centers, as required by federal regulations and as requested by the University of Wisconsin (UW) System Administration. We also included the state grants in our awards testing for compliance with state statutes as requested by the Wisconsin Higher Educational Aids Board. Our audit period was July 1, 1987, through June 30, 1989.

The first and second sections of our report contain the student financial assistance programs' financial statements for the UW-Madison, UW-Green Bay, and UW Centers and the related independent auditor's report. The following sections contain the auditor's report. The following sections contain the auditor's report on the internal control structure deficiencies and findings of noncompliance for the UW-Madison, UW-Green Bay, and UW Centers. The last section contains our comments on the status of the recommendations made during the prior audit conducted by the UW-System Internal Audit and our prior audit (88-19) of the health professions financial aid programs.

Except for questioned costs of \$2,167 and minor compliance errors, we found the UW-Madison, UW-Green Bay, and UW Centers administered the student financial assistance programs as required by federal regulations and state statutes. The UW-Madison, UW-Green Bay, and UW Centers did not consistently follow the proper refund calculation and allocation procedures when returning funds to the financial aid programs for withdrawing students.

We appreciate the courtesy and cooperation extended to us by the UW-Madison, UW-Green Bay, and UW Centers staff during our audit. The comments on individual audit findings by the UW-Madison, UW-Green Bay, and UW Centers are within the body of our report and the overall responses are the appendices.
