On behalf of the Association of Milwaukee County Attorney's, I would like you to consider an alternative to Governor Thompson's proposal affecting District Attorneys. Although we fully recognize the positive aspects in shifting the funding of D.A.'s from the counties to the state, we also see several negative consequence arising from the current proposal—most notably the loss of collective bargaining rights. Therefore, I would encourage you to review and adopt our proposed alternative calling for a state salary supplement.

Through this alternative, property tax relief will be maintained and pay equity will addressed by allowing the following:

- ♦ Counties will be reimbursed by the state for 75% of the salaries for district attorneys, deputy district attorneys, and assistant district attorneys.
- ♦ Salaries will be based on the salary ranges for executive salary group 6 for DA's and the state compensation plan for staff attorneys employed in the office of the state attorney general for assistants and deputies
- ◆ Continuation of collective bargaining which insulates the assistant D.A.'s from the inherent political forces surrounding local the D.A.
- ♦ Allows counties to respond to the distinct needs of their local residents.

We strongly believe that this proposal will go a long way in meeting the goal of pay equity for rural counties, allowing for substantial property tax relief, and providing for continuance of collective bargaining for 13 counties throughout Wisconsin.

SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT NO._____ TO BUDGET BILL

(Senate Bill 32)

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Delete all sections of Senate Bill 32 pertaining to state take-over of the district attorney function.

SECTION 2. 59.43 of the statutes is created to read:

- 59.43 SALARIES OF DISTRICT ATTORNEY, DEPUTY DISTRICT

 ATTORNEY AND ASSISTANT DISTRICT ATTORNEY. (1) LEGISLATIVE

 INTENT. This section shall be interpreted to effectuate the following express legislative purposes:
- (a) to encourage increased experience and professionalism in the prosecution function throughout the state;
- (b) to insure over the years that district attorneys are paid at minimum the equivalent of executive salary group 6 in the state service; and that deputy and assistant district attorneys are paid at minimum in accordance with the pay scale for assistant attorneys general;
- (c) to retain flexibility, local option, and local control by mandating salaries in a way beneficial to counties, but not mandating duties which County Boards have the option of assigning district attorneys under the statutes and laws of Wisconsin.

- (2) REIMBURSEMENT TO COUNTIES. A county shall be reimbursed at 75% of the salaries of district attorney, deputy district attorney, and assistant district attorney as set forth in section (3) provided that:
- (a) salaries paid are as set forth in section (3) below; and
- (b) reimbursement will be for prosecution duties which include:

1. criminal actions.
