Dear Speaker Kunicki:

This is to inform you that I have appointed a subcommittee to recommend statutory and administrative changes which would strengthen the system of discipline and the disciplinary functions of the Medical Examining Board in the Department of Regulation and Licensing. Based upon testimony at an informational hearing by the Committee on Public Health and Regulation, there clearly is room for improvement in the way the state pursues serious physician disciplinary actions.

We heard testimony from diverse groups including the Department of Regulation and Licensing, the department's Medical Examining Board, Wisconsin Academy of Trial Lawyers, State Medical Society, Center for Public Representation, Wisconsin Action Coalition and American Association of Retired Persons. These groups seemed to be saying many of the same things in suggesting clear directions to reduce the backlog of cases, improve timeliness and enhance the state's authority to remove true offenders from practice.

To formalize these recommendations and to present a proposal to the full committee, I have appointed Rep. Hough (chair), Rep. Urban, and myself to serve on the

subcommittee. Thank you for your attention. Best wishes.
