Section 3023 (31n) of 1989 Wisconsin Act 31 directed the Department to develop a cost comparison of nurse's assistant training programs and submit a report to the chief clerk of each house of the Legislature.

A survey requesting training program charges was requested of all Wisconsin training programs in May 1991. Section two identifies the number of nursing home staff statewide who are trained as nurse's assistants. Section three reports the rate of attrition from the profession of nurse's assistants in 1989 and 1990.

These data were collected during the annual survey of nursing homes conducted by the Center Health Statistics in the Division of Health.
