To the Honorable, the Assembly:

1989 Wisconsin Act 31 authorized the Department of Health and Social Services to seek federal approval to establish a rural primary health care demonstration project in a medically underserved community in the state. The project was to be staffed by nurse practitioners. Congressional action mandating that state Medical Assistance Programs reimburse services provided by nurse practitioners, however, obviated the need for the rural demonstration. Accordingly, the Department began certifying and reimbursing nurse practitioners under Medical Assistance beginning July 1, 1990.

Due to legislative and Department interest in the effect of the new nurse practitioner provision, the Department agreed to conduct a review of the reimbursement changes and report its findings to the chief clerk of each house by March 1, 1992. The attached report describes the findings of the review.
