Read first time and referred:

**Assembly Bill 4, October 1991 Special Session**

Relating to the educational assessment program; educational program reviews; management restructuring programs; state aid for additional school days; grants for collaborative service programs and projects; grants for mathematics and science programs; grants for staff development; state aid incentives for school district consolidation; a uniform pupil transcript; advanced placement examinations; head start supplements; the postsecondary enrollment options program; community service activities; the issuance of promissory notes by 1st class city school districts; the pupil minimum competency testing program; the school performance report; school district audits; creating a student readiness study committee and a committee on educational goals; written policies on entering locker rooms being used by athletic teams representing certain schools; coordinating and publicizing the exchange of teachers and school administrators; pupil participation in school activities; teacher, principal and vice principal evaluations; the annual meeting of the Milwaukee school board; the disclosure of college entrance examinations; providing for studies; granting rule-making authority; and making appropriations.
