Pursuant to action taken by the Board of Regents during its regular monthly meeting on April 10, 1992, I am transmitting the Design for Diversity Progress Report as required under s. 36.25 (14m)(b) of the Wisconsin Statutes.

The 1990-91 Design for Diversity Progress Report fulfills the requirement in Section 36.25 (14m)(b) of the

Wisconsin State Statutes that the Board of Regents report annually on its precollege, recruitment and retention plan for minority and disadvantaged students enrolled in the System. This report must also include information on financial aid programs serving minority and disadvantaged students. The report includes information concerning:

- 1) New student recruitment and retention
- 2) Minority faculty and staff hiring
- 3) Student financial assistance
- 4) Financial expenditures for minority and disadvantaged student programs, and
- 5) Minority and disadvantaged student program evaluations.

To the Honorable, the Assembly:

Upon request of the Wisconsin Arts Board, we have completed a review of the Board's general fiscal procedures and management of the Arts Challenge Initiative (ACI) program. In fiscal year 1992-93, the ACI program will provide \$1 million in grants to arts organizations throughout the state, making it the Board's largest single grant program.

Overall, we found the general fiscal procedures used by the Board to be sound. We also found grants have been made appropriately under the ACI program. To assist the Board's ongoing efforts to increase accountability over funds distributed, we suggest several options which the Board could use to verify financial information submitted by local arts organizations.

The audit report includes no major findings, conclusions, or recommendations, and in our judgment, is not likely to be of interest to most members of the Legislature.
