To the Honorable the Legislature:

This report is transmitted as required by sec.20.002(11)(f)
of the Wisconsin Statutes, (for distribution to the
appropriate standing committees under sec. 13.172(3)
Stats.), and confirms that the Department of
Administration has found it necessary to exercise the
"temporary reallocation of balances" authority provided
by this section in order to meet payment responsibilities

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and cover resulting negative balances during the month of September, 1992.

On September 22, 1992, the Environment Clean-up Fund balance was \$-99 thousand. This shortfall continued until September 24, 1992 when the balance reached \$1.3 million. This shortfall was due to the timing of revenues to the Fund.

The Environmental Clean-up Fund shortfall was not in excess of the \$400 million ceiling and did not exceed the balances of the Funds available for interfund borrowing.

The distribution of interest earning to investment pool participants is based on the average daily balance in the pool and each fund's share. Therefore, the monthly calculation by State Finance will automatically reflect the use of these temporary reallocations of balance authority.
