1. The legal definitions of, and penalties for, sexual assault under SS. 940.225 and 948.013, sexual exploitation by a therapist under S. 940.22 and harassment under S. 947.013.
 2. Generally available national and state statistics on sexual assaults and on sexual assaults by acquaintances of the victims.
 3. The rights of victims under Ch. 950 and the services available at Mid-State Technical College and in the community to assist a student who is the victim of sexual assault or sexual harassment.
 4. Protective behaviors, including methods of recognizing and avoiding sexual assault and

sexual harassment, and location in the community where courses on protective behaviors are provided.

- B. Mid-State Technical College annually supplies all students enrolled in the district, printed material that includes all of the above information.

Enclosed is a copy of the handouts given to MSTC students. The booklets are distributed and discussed at full-time student orientation. The single information sheets are handed out and discussed at the first class meeting of all evening school classes.
