Attached to this letter is the third version of the Clean Water Fund Biennial Finance Plan for FY 1993-1995.

This plan was prepared jointly by the Department of Natural Resources and the Department of Administration Capital Finance Office. Its purpose is to support the administration of the Clean Water Fund which provides financial assistance to municipalities that are required to construct new wastewater treatment facilities to protect the surface water and groundwater of Wisconsin. The first version of the plan, which was submitted to your office on August 17, 1992, reflected the Department of Natural Resources biennial budget proposal to the Governor. The second version, which was submitted to your office on March 24, 1993 was updated to reflect the Governor's proposed biennial budget. This third version of the plan reflects the adopted biennial budget.

The preparation, submission, and review of the Biennial Finance Plan by the Joint Committee on Finance,

environmental legislative standing committees and the Building Commission is required under s. 144.2415(3), Stats. The statute allows the Joint Committee on Finance and each standing committee to submit to the Building Commission its recommendations and comments regarding each version of the Biennial Finance Plan.
