Relating to: the purchase of health care coverage by private employers through a program offered by the group insurance board and requiring the governor to submit a health care study and legislation to the legislature regarding a universal health care plan; creating a council on private employer health care coverage; health insurance market reform; creating a basic health insurance plan; establishing a subsidy program for premiums under that plan; seeking a federal waiver or federal legislation regarding medical assistance; medical assistance benefits and providers; medical benefits under the general relief and relief of needy Indian persons programs; granting rule-making authority; and providing a penalty.
