To the Honorable the Legislature:

Pursuant to the requirements of 1993 Wisconsin Act 16, Section 9130(3t), I am transmitting an interim report on the study of topsoil depth for private sewage systems.

The report was prepared by E. Jerry Tyler, Director of the UW-Madison Small Scale Waste Management Project in cooperation with the department. The project is measuring the treatment of bacteria, viruses, nitrogen and phosphorus in various soils to a depth of 42 inches below the bed of existing septic systems. To complete the work more sites need to be selected for intensive study and repeat sampling and analysis must be conducted. Much of this work will be completed by December and documented in a second interim report. To test hydraulic failure, wet season observation will be required. This work cannot be completed until the spring of 1995. Subsequently, a final report will not be available until July 1, 1995. Please contact Bennette D. Executive Order Number 226

Relating to a Proclamation Ordering that the National and State Flags be Flown at Half-Staff Due to the Death of Mayor Henry W. Maier

WHEREAS, Mayor Henry W. Maier served as Mayor of the City of Milwaukee with honor and distinction; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Henry W. Maier died on Sunday, July 17, 1994;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TOMMY G. THOMPSON, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by Federal and State law, do hereby:

Order that the National and State flags on all State buildings and State grounds located in the City of Milwaukee be flown at half-staff from July 19, 1994 until sunset July 22, 1994; and

Order that the National and State flags on all State buildings and State grounds located in the State of Wisconsin be flown at half-staff from sunrise July 22, 1994 until sunset July 22, 1994.
