PETITIONS AND COMMUNICATIONS State of Wisconsin Department of Administration February 12, 1993

To the Honorable the Legislature:

This report is transmitted as required by sec. 20.002(11)(f) of the Wisconsin Statutes, (for distribution to the appropriate standing committees under sec. 13.172(3) Stats.), and confirms that the Department of

Administration has found it necessary to exercise the "temporary reallocation of balances" authority provided by this section in order to meet payment responsibilities and cover resulting negative balances during the month of January, 1993.

On January 1, 1992 the <u>Elderly Property Tax Deferral</u> <u>Fund</u> balance was \$-72 thousand. This shortfall continued through January 31st when the balance was \$-68 thousand. The shortfall is due to an excessive General Fund transfer, and is being corrected.

The Elderly Property Tax Deferral Fund shortfall was not in excess of the \$400 million ceiling and did not exceed the balances of the Funds available for interfund borrowing.

The distribution of interest earnings to investment pool participants is based on the average daily balance in the pool and each fund's share. Therefore, the monthly calculation by State Finance will automatically reflect the use of these temporary reallocations of balance authority.
