To the Honorable the Legislature:

Pursuant to action taken by the University of Wisconsin System Board of Regents during its regular meeting on November 5, 1993, I am transmitting the Report on Solid Waste Experiment Centers, required under s. 36.25(3m)(e) of the Wisconsin Statutes.

1989 Wisconsin Act 31 created section 36.25(3m)(b) of the statutes which provides that:

"The board may establish one or more solid waste experiment centers for the purpose of developing, demonstrating, promoting and assessing the costs and environmental effects of alternatives to solid waste disposal. The board shall determine the location of the solid waste experiment centers. In making the determination, the board shall consider

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the solid waste disposal needs of the various regions of the state. The board may establish, through cooperative agreements, solid waste experiment centers at existing publicly owned or privately owned storage, treatment or disposal facilities."

Section 36.25(3m)(e) provides that:

"Annually, the board shall submit a report to the chief clerk of each house of the legislature for distribution to the appropriate standing committees under s. 13.172(3) on all activities undertaken under this subsection."

This is the fourth annual report submitted to meet the statutory requirements. The College of Natural Resources at UW-Stevens Point, which was designated as a Solid Waste Experiment Center in June 1990, is in the process of completing a four-year study entitled "Landspreading of Compost on Agricultural Lands," which has been funded with a total of \$254,500. Beginning in fiscal year 1990-91 the recycling law, 1989 Wisconsin Act 335, providing additional research funding and directed the Board of Regents to appoint a Solid Waste Research Council to advise the System concerning the awarding of funds for research projects under 36.25(3m)(c). In response to the requests for proposals issued to disburse 1993-94 funding, the Council received 26 research proposals from eight UW System campuses. The Council reviewed the proposals and sought comments and advice from 21 reviewers not affiliated with the System. I granted approval to fund eight projects recommended by the Council and totaling \$248,000. These projects are summarized in the report.

This report is transmitted as required by sec. 20.002(11)(f) of the Wisconsin Statutes, (for distribution to the appropriate standing committees under sec. 13.172(3) Stats.), and confirms that the Department of Administration has found it necessary to exercise the "temporary reallocation of balances" authority provided by this section in order to meet payment responsibilities and cover resulting negative balances during the month of September, 1993.

On September 16, 1993 the University Trust-Income Fund balance was \$-27 thousand. The shortfall was due to an accounting error and was corrected the next day.

The University Trust-Income Fund shortfall was not in excess of the \$400 million ceiling and did not exceed the balances of the Funds available for interfund borrowing.

The distribution of interest earnings to investment pool participants is based on the average daily balance in the pool and each fund's share. Therefore, the monthly calculation by State Finance will automatically reflect the use of these temporary reallocations of balance authority.
