Pursuant to the requirements of section 153.10(1), Wis. Stat., I am pleased to submit to the Governor and to the Legislature the quarterly *Health Care Data Report*. This report is based on hospital inpatient discharge data reported to the Office of Health Care Information by all operating general medical-surgical and specialty hospitals in Wisconsin for the second quarter of 1993 (April - June). It also contains selected outpatient surgery utilization and charge data from general medical-surgical hospitals and freestanding ambulatory surgery centers in Wisconsin during the same quarter.

The report fulfills the statutory requirement to report "in a manner that permits comparisons among hospitals ... the charges for up to 100 health care services or diagnostic-related groups selected by the office."

To the Honorable the Legislature:

Section 9130(4x) of 1993 Wisconsin Act 16 (the 1993-95 biennial budget bill) required the Department to submit a plan by January 1, 1994 to the Legislature and the Governor for converting the private sewage system grant program to a loan program.

I regret to inform you the Department was unable to meet the reporting timeline and additional time will be needed to develop an adequate grant to loan conversion plan. Our delay has been caused in part by the need to coordinate with a number of other agencies that have lending expertise to ensure the plan properly addresses lending issues, and we have been unable to complete that process.

I will keep you apprised of our progress and have instructed that a plan be reported no later than July 1, 1994.

To the Honorable the Legislature:

As required by s.115.38, Wis. Stats., I am transmitting the 1992-93 School Performance Report. Under the law, school districts are required to prepare and distribute reports to parents and guardians by January 1 of each year, and the State Superintendent of Public Instruction is required to prepare a statewide summary and submit it to the legislature on an annual basis.

Wisconsin law divides information in the School Performance Report into three categories:

- * Indicators of academic achievement, including results of the Third Grade Reading Test, the Advanced Placement examination, and the Enhanced ACT.

- * Other indicators of school and district performance, including information about dropouts, attendance, retention in grade, graduation, suspensions, expulsions, participation in extra-/co-curricular and school-sponsored community activities, advanced course work, and postsecondary intentions.

- * Staffing and financial information to be determined by the state superintendent.

Although the information contained in this report is an important element of educational accountability, it is not a complete picture. The School Performance Report is a starting point for the public discussion that is vital to understanding students and schools.

The efforts of many people throughout the state made the 1992-93 School Performance Report an excellent collection of statistics and information. Those same people will continue to work on this project in the months and years ahead. It is my hope that, as we link the data to Wisconsin's educational goals, this document will become a tool to measure the efforts of young people and schools.

Pursuing educational excellence is a long journey. If we are to persevere and stay the course, we must be child-centered. We need to work as a community, and we need to be aware of the successes and the problems we will confront along the way. Hopefully, the School Performance Report will help illuminate that journey.
