To the Honorable, the Senate:

I have approved **Senate Bill 106** as 1993 Wisconsin Act 243 and have deposited it in the Office of the Secretary of State. I have exercised by partial veto authority in Sections 40, 43, 44 and 45.

**Senate Bill 106** directs the Departments of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP), Transportation (DOT), Industry, Labor and Human Relations (DILHR), Natural Resources (DNR), Development (DOD) and the Wisconsin Housing and Economic Development Authority (WHEDA) to implement provisions that will limit the release of Ozone depleting substances.

Sections 40, 43, 44 and 45 require DOD to deny participation to firms that receive tax benefits, grants or loans from the Wisconsin Development Fund, the Seed

Capitol Program and the Development Zone Program, if the firms fail to certify that the manufacturing processes of the firm will not increase the use of ozone depleting substances. I am partially vetoing these sections because they unnecessarily restrict business eligibility for economic development grants and loans from the Department of Development. I respect the Legislature's effort to address the problems associated with ozone depleting substances, but I feel this restriction on DOD's business incentive programs does not contribute to the goal. It is already unlikely that firms will increase use of these substances since they are being phased-out under the Montreal Protocol and, due to a production ban under the Clean Air Act, prices for ozone depleting substances are increasing at a rate that will eventually make them prohibitively expensive to use. In addition, I feel this establishes the bad precedent of adding unnecessary restrictions on DOD programs. As a result of this partial veto, businesses eligible for DOD loans and grants under current law, will not be unduly restricted.

**Senate Bill 106** will limit the release of ozone depleting substances. With my partial vetoes, these substances will still be limited without placing an undue burden on the Department of Development's business incentive programs.
