EXECUTIVE ORDER #220

Relating to a Special Session of the Legislature

I, TOMMY G. THOMPSON, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Article IV, section 11 and Article V, section 4 of the Constitution of Wisconsin do require the convening of a special session of the Legislature at the Capitol in Madison, beginning on June 7, 1994 at 10:00 A.M. soley to consider and act upon:

- Legislation relating to testing defendants in certain criminal actions and children in certain delinquency proceedings for HIV infection and certain diseases and requiring certain counseling and referral for persons infected with HIV or acquired immunodeficiency syndrome.
- relating to regulation 2. Legislation of the telecommunications industry, statutes affecting telecommunications, creating a telecommunications retraining board, surveillance of state agencies and authorities. fraudulent data alteration. confidentiality of pharmaceutical records, state master lease agreements, granting rule-making authority, providing an exemption from emergency rule procedures, extending the time limit for emergency rules, making appropriations and providing penalties.
