Dear Senator Leean and Representative Linton:

I have approved increased expenditure authority of \$11,100 PRO in FY94 in the Department of Justice's Gifts, Grants and Proceeds appropriation. Attached is a copy of the department's request. The increased expenditure authority will fund training costs for state attorneys and civil investigators.

Department of Justice Request for Program Revenue Expenditure Authority

Background:

Attached is a request from the Department of Justice (DOJ) for additional PRO expenditure authority in their gifts, grants and proceeds continuing appropriation. Unlike most agencies, where DOA has unilateral authority to approve increases in continuing appropriations, increases in this particular DOJ continuing appropriation also requires the review of the Joint Committee on Finance.

Request:

DOJ is requesting increased PRO expenditure authority of \$11,100 in FY94 for the following:

- 1. Ethics Conference for State Attorneys (\$7,700) -- DOJ requests additional expenditure authority for the DOJ sponsored conference on ethics problems facing state attorneys. The conference is scheduled for October 28, 1993. Attendance at the conference by state attorneys will satisfy the mandatory continuing legal education requirements for ethics training which was recently imposed by the Wisconsin Supreme Court. The revenues to support the additional expenditure authority will be derived from participant registration fees.
- 2. <u>Civil Investigator Training (\$3,400)</u> -- DOJ requests additional expenditure authority to cover the costs of a civil investigator training program. Revenues to support the additional expenditure authority will be derived from registration fees.

Recommendation:

Approve increased expenditure authority totaling \$11,100 PRO in FY94. The proposed uses of the funds are consistent with the purposes for which they were collected.

Based on these estimates, the Department requests \$7,700 in expenditure authority for a conference on ethics problems facing the State's attorneys.

Civil Investigators Training

As has been done in the past, the Division of Legal Services has scheduled a civil investigators training program for employes of various state agencies. This program has proven to be an effective means of enhancing the skills of investigators across state government.

The program is scheduled for September 27-29, 1993. Approximately 50 registrations are anticipated, including 10 from the Department of Justice.

Subject: CONFERENCE AND TRAINING SPENDING AUTHORITY

The Department of Justice requests expenditure authority of \$11,100 for SFY 1994 in the appropriation under s. 20.455 (3)(g), which provides an approval process for receiving and spending PR funds for training and conferences. This request covers two separate conference or training situations.

Ethics Problems For Attorneys

The Department is sponsoring a conference scheduled for October 28, 1993, to address practical ethical problems facing attorneys in state government. All attorneys employed by the State who are headquartered in Madison will be invited to attend, although registrations will be limited to approximately 350.

This conference will address important issues facing the State's attorneys. It will also provide an opportunity for Justice attorneys to interact with their clients and with administrative law judges on issues of mutual concern. Attendance at this conference will satisfy the mandatory continuing legal education requirement for ethics training which was recently imposed by the Wisconsin Supreme Court, and at a very reasonable cost.

The conference will be held at the Memorial Union, because of its convenient location, appropriate accommodations and low costs. The format will involve both a meeting of the whole, as well as smaller sessions dealing with separate ethics issues.
