



**SENATE AMENDMENT 5,
TO 1995 ASSEMBLY BILL 69**

November 9, 1995 - Offered by Senator WINEKE.

1 At the locations indicated, amend the bill as follows:

2 **1.** Page 2, line 6: delete lines 6 to 19, as affected by assembly amendment 3,
3 and substitute:

4 “(4) (a) Nothing in this section prohibits a political subdivision from continuing
5 to enforce an ordinance or resolution that is in effect on the effective date of this
6 paragraph [revisor inserts date], and that regulates the sale, purchase, purchase
7 delay, transfer, ownership, use, keeping, possession, bearing, transportation,
8 licensing, permitting, registration or taxation of any firearm or part of a firearm,
9 including ammunition and reloader components, up until the date of the next spring
10 or general election that is held not less than 45 days after the effective date of this
11 paragraph [revisor inserts date], except that, if the existing ordinance or
12 resolution is approved in a referendum that is held in the political subdivision at that
13 next spring or general election, the political subdivision may continue to enforce the
14 ordinance or resolution after the date of the election. The ballot question shall be
15 “Shall the [name of political subdivision] continue to enforce the [ordinance or

1 resolution] which does the following: “[text or summary of the ordinance or
2 resolution]?””

3 (b) Nothing in this section prohibits a political subdivision from enacting and
4 enforcing an ordinance or adopting and enforcing a resolution or, subject to par. (a),
5 amending an ordinance or resolution that is in effect on the effective date of this
6 paragraph [revisor inserts date], after the effective date of this paragraph
7 [revisor inserts date], that regulates the sale, purchase, purchase delay, transfer,
8 ownership, use, keeping, possession, bearing, transportation, licensing, permitting,
9 registration or taxation of any firearm or part of a firearm, including ammunition
10 and reloader components, if the ordinance, resolution or amendment is approved in
11 a referendum that is held in the political subdivision.

12 (bm) No ordinance or resolution that is enacted or adopted under sub. (2) or
13 which is subject to par. (a) or (b) applies to or may be enforced against an individual
14 who is traveling directly through the political subdivision in which the ordinance or
15 resolution is in effect if the individual is a nonresident of that political subdivision
16 and if the firearm or part of a firearm, including ammunition and reloader
17 components, is unloaded and encased while the individual is in the political
18 subdivision.”.

19 **2.** Page 2, line 21: after “(2)” insert: “, or a county ordinance or resolution that
20 is enacted, adopted or amended under sub. (4) (b)”.

21 **3.** Page 2, line 23: after “(2)” insert “or (4) (b)”.
