



1995 ASSEMBLY BILL 645

October 27, 1995 - Introduced by Representatives SCHNEIDER, ROBSON, BOCK, GRONEMUS, GROTHMAN, HANSON, LORGE, OTT, PLOMBON, SERATTI, SILBAUGH and KREUSER, cosponsored by Senators BRESKE and SCHULTZ. Referred to Joint survey committee on Tax Exemptions.

1 **AN ACT to amend** 77.52 (2) (a) 5. of the statutes; **relating to:** exempting certain
2 telecommunications services from the sales tax.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill creates a sales tax exemption for telecommunications services that allow persons who have transmitters to communicate with a hospital when they need medical attention.

This bill will be referred to the joint survey committee on tax exemptions for a detailed analysis, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

3 **SECTION 1.** 77.52 (2) (a) 5. of the statutes is amended to read:
4 77.52 (2) (a) 5. The sale of telecommunications services, not including services
5 paid for by the insertion of coins in a coin-operated telephone and not including
6 services that allow persons who have transmitters to communicate with a hospital
7 when they need medical attention, that originate in this state and are charged to a
8 service address in this state, regardless of the location where that charge is billed or
9 paid.
