

### Statement of Need

The U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service's Office of Migratory Bird Management's 1995 preliminary harvest-management principles for ducks indicated that some liberalization in bag limits, season length or both was possible without impeding population growth in the traditional surveyed areas. The Mississippi Flyway Council recommended a harvest objective consistent with maintaining a 900,000 bird spring population for the Mississippi Valley Population (MVP) of Canada geese. The harvest objective for this population increased by about 40% compared to last year. The major MVP harvest states adjusted their individual regulations to account for this increase.

Wisconsin received a base MVP maximum allowable harvest of 92,000 Canada geese this year (58,400 in 1994, 46,600 in 1993 and 60,000 in 1992). MVP Canada geese make up 80.8% (90% previously) of our Canada goose harvest. Thus, Wisconsin's statewide maximum allowable harvest is 113,900 this year (72,300 in 1994, 51,800 in 1993 and 66,700 in 1992.).

The Mississippi Flyway Council recommended Wisconsin again receive a separate harvest allocation of 4,500 Canada geese for use in abating crop damage caused by geese.

### Modifications as a Result of Public Hearing

As a result of comments at the public hearings and final regulations from the federal government, the duck season was lengthened from 40 to 50 days, and the bag limit was increased from 4 to 5 ducks (still only one canvasback). The goose season in the Exterior zone was extended from 70 to 86 days, from 61 to 65 days in the Collins zone and a 70 day season in the Mississippi River subzone was established.

At the Natural Resources Board meeting, the dates for the duck season were modified to allow the season to extend until November 26. A split season was established north of U.S. highway 10. The season dates were modified for the Canada goose season and one day was added to the Mississippi River subzone season.

ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD  
REPEALING AND RECREATING RULES

The Wisconsin Natural Resources Board proposes an order to amend NR 10.125(4) (a) and repeal and recreate NR 10.01(1) (b), (g) and (u) relating to the 1995 migratory game bird season.

Analysis Prepared by Department of Natural Resources

Statutory authority: ss. 29.085, 29.174(3) and 227.11(2) (a), Stats.

Statutes interpreted: ss. 29.085, 29.102, 29.174(1) and (2), Stats.

The proposed rules establish the regulations for the 1995 migratory game bird season. The significant regulations are:

**Ducks.** The state is divided into two zones each with 50-day seasons. The season south of U.S. Highway 10 begins at noon September 30 and continues through October 8 and, following an 8-day closed period, reopens October 17 and continues through November 26. The season north of U.S. Highway 10 begins at noon September 30 and continues through October 8 and following a 5 day closed period, reopens October 14 and continues through November 23. The daily bag in both zones is 5 ducks, including four mallards and one canvasback for the entire 50 days in both zones.

**Canada Geese.** The state is apportioned into 3 goose hunting zones: Horicon, Collins and Exterior. Other special goose management subzones within the Exterior Zone include Brown County, Burnett County, New Auburn, Rock Prairie and the Mississippi River. Season lengths are: Collins Zone - 65 days; Horicon Zone - 80 days; Exterior Zone - 86 days; and Mississippi River Subzone - 70 and 71 days. The Burnett County and New Auburn subzones are closed to Canada goose hunting.

NR 10.125(4) (a) Harvest reports. The department may require each successful applicant to ~~complete and~~ submit a harvest report ~~on forms supplied~~ in a manner prescribed by the department within 48 hours of harvesting a goose.
