Dear Representative Musser:

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on LRB 1847/1 relating to providing assistance to incarcerated veterans. As you know, this draft mirrors part of a Substitute Amendment to 1993 Assembly Bill 926, which we worked on with Representative Bolle's office. While we have no objection to the proposed draft, there are two comments I should make.

First, the only real difference between what is required of WDVA in this legislation and our current practice is that the legislation directs us to contact all veterans identified by DOC and inform them of our ability to determine their status as veterans. Currently, prisoners identify themselves as veterans if they wish and we provide those veterans who are interested the opportunity to hear about our services in a group meeting with a follow up meeting with a USDVA representative if requested. The current system seems to be working fine from our perspective.

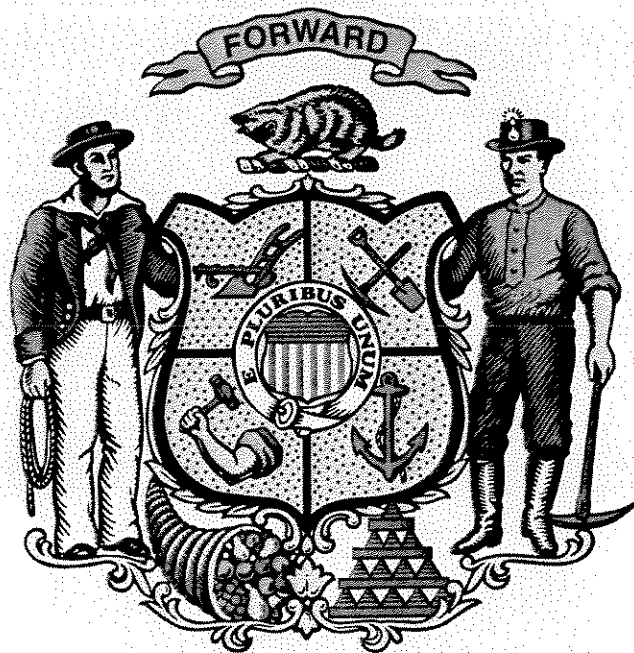
In addition, the legislation would require new efforts from CVSOs. Currently, CVSOs leave prisoner liaison efforts almost entirely to us; in fact, some counties with correctional institutions forbid their CVSOs from working with inmates of that institution. If you haven't already, you may want to ask the CVSO Association for their thoughts on this. 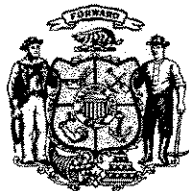

Dear Representative Musser:

I received your letter requesting department input on LRB-1847/1 relating to services for imprisoned veterans.

In the past, the department worked with VETS House, a program funded by the Wisconsin Department of Veterans Affairs, to provide services to institutionalized veterans. We are now working directly with the Wisconsin Department of Veterans Affairs in implementing the Veterans Rehabilitation Program for homeless veterans and veterans in danger of becoming homeless.

The department currently notifies the Department of Veterans Affairs of all inmates received at Dodge Correctional Institution. Inmates are informed of programming and veterans services. Institutions have contact staff, arrange for DVA counselors to visit inmates at institutions and may arrange for DVA medical staff to conduct screenings. The established release planning process may include coordination with the county veteran's service officer. The establishment of organized veterans self help groups depends on inmate interest and available staff resources. Such groups are active at some institutions.

As a part of our review of LRB-1847/1, institution wardens were asked to provide input on the impact of this proposed legislation over and above services already provided. Currently we have over 1,400 inmates in prison who report military experience. Assuming that all of these inmates need some type of services, additional staff resources will be needed to ensure provision of services mandated by this proposal.

In addition the Department has the following concerns:

1. Medical screening should be done by DVA staff who are trained and familiar with DVA criteria.
2. The determination of eligibility for benefits should remain the duty of DVA representatives who are familiar with regulations and criteria.
3. The draft allows a prisoner to send sealed correspondence to county veterans' service officers or the Department of Veterans Affairs. Most correspondence that may not be opened for inspection relates to legal matters or is addressed to elected officials. We do not see a demonstrated need to exempt DVA related mail from inspection for contraband.



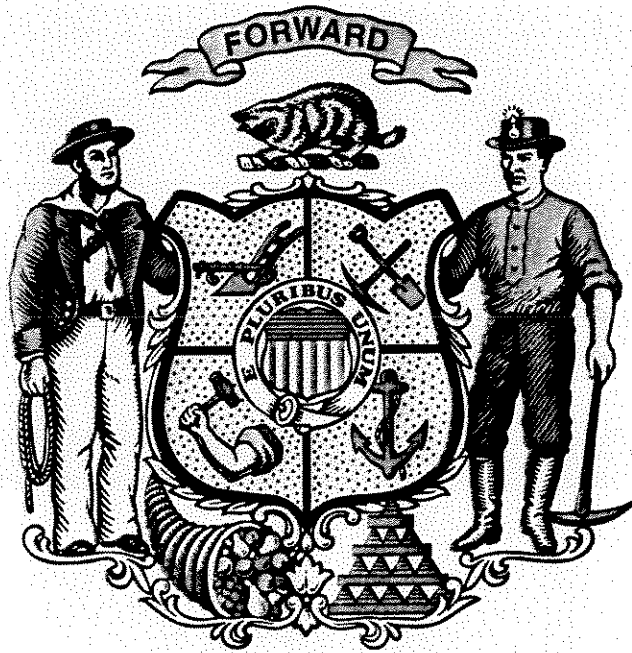

Per your request, attached is the Chapter 20 appropriation table for WDVA. The Department will receive total GPR funds of \$1,332,100 in FY96 and \$1,570,800 in FY97. Of those amounts, \$582,200 and \$551,500 represent interest payments that will be lapsed back to the General Fund as GPR earned in FY96 and FY97, respectively. Below is a detailed breakdown of the Department's net GPR budget:

The total net GPR funding for the biennium represents less than one-percent of the Department's total 1995-97 biennial budget.

Recall that the biennial budget bill, in consideration of the passage of SB 183 (creation of a hospital at King), also requires the Veterans Home to lapse \$440,000 to the general fund at the end of FY 97. This is not the usual case where we are provided state money up front and lapse back to the general fund the same amount when we receive reimbursement from the federal government. Rather, the budget simply requires us to lapse \$440,000 that would normally stay at King.

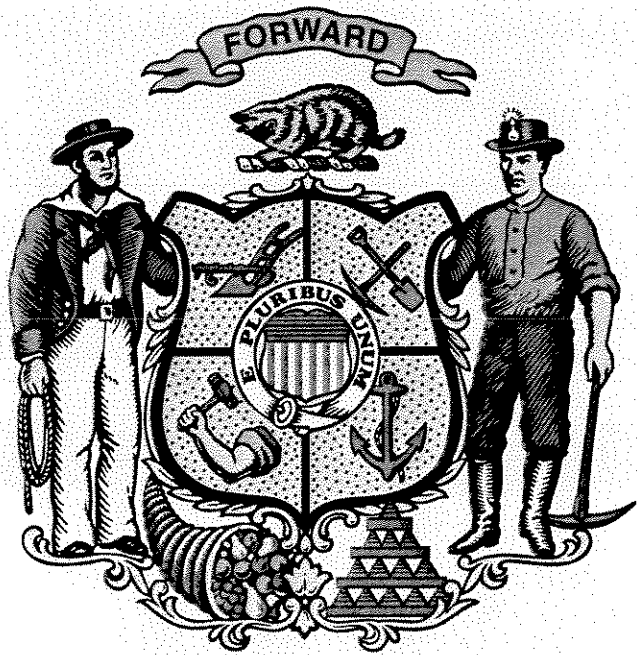

Thank you for contacting me in regard to eligibility criteria for the Kewaunee County Veterans Service Officer position. I appreciate being alerted to the problem.

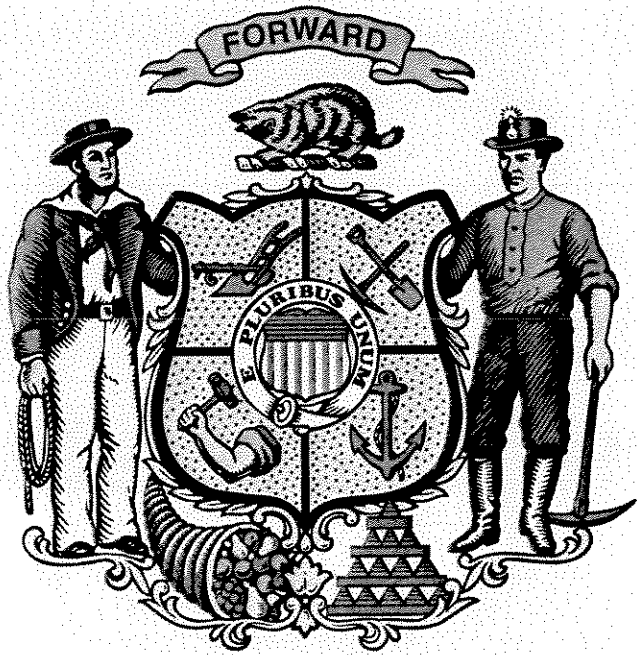
