## Legislative Update

We are happy to report that we still see little significant support for the hospital public authority among legislators and that legislators from both parties are either opposed to the proposal or at least want to see it taken out of the budget bill so it can be looked at more carefully. You've made the difference here. If the public hears the truth about this proposal, it will fail. The only way we can combat the enormous resources of the university and the hospital is if you get the truth out to the public. Contact your steward or local office for more written materials.

### Does Gordon Derzon speak for you?

Displeased with legislative prospects, hospital management has launched a desperate disinformation campaign depicting "grassroots" support for the hospital restructuring. A March 19 newspaper advertisement listed 40 hospital employees who support the public authority and stated that the ad was paid for by a "grassroots number of hospital employees" (sic). The list consisted entirely of department heads, supervisors, nurses who supervise or work in administration, Human Resources department employees, and other administrative staffers! We couldn't find a single classified, union-represented employee.

Superintendent Gordon Derzon, according to a Joint Finance Committee member speaking on March 20, said hospital employees supported a public authority and that employee unions simply had not yet caught on. Clearly, unless each of us takes personal responsibility to express opposition to the proposal, the hospital is going to misrepresent our views.

### Are you going to let them get away with it?

Here is what you can do:

- Sign the petition on the reverse side immediately. We need these back by to the local offices by Friday so you need to move fast. We will present them to Joint Finance so that you can express your real opinion without the "assistance" of Mr. Derzon.
- Call both co-chairs of the Joint Finance Committee immediately to let them know that you oppose the public authority.


