1997 WISCONSIN ACT 162

AN ACT to create 40.02 (3) (d), 40.02 (3) (e), 40.02 (12m) and 40.02 (55g) of the statutes; relating to: the determination of the annual earnings period under the Wisconsin retirement system for certain technical college district and cooperative educational service agency employees.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 40.02 (3) (d) of the statutes is created to read:

40.02 (3) (d) For a technical college educational support personnel employe who terminates participating employment on or after the July 1 that occurs after the effective date of this paragraph [revisor inserts date], it means the period beginning on July 1 and ending on the following June 30. This paragraph applies to periods beginning after the June 30 that occurs after the effective date of this paragraph [revisor inserts date].

SECTION 2. 40.02 (3) (e) of the statutes is created to read:

40.02 (3) (e) For a cooperative educational service agency support personnel employe who terminates par-

ticipating employment on or after the July 1 that occurs after the effective date of this paragraph [revisor inserts date], it means the period beginning on July 1 and ending on the following June 30. This paragraph applies to periods beginning after the June 30 that occurs after the effective date of this paragraph [revisor inserts date].

SECTION 3. 40.02 (12m) of the statutes is created to read:

40.02 (12m) "Cooperative educational service agency support personnel employe" means a person who is a cooperative educational service agency employe, but who is not a teacher.

SECTION 4. 40.02 (55g) of the statutes is created to read:

40.02 (55g) "Technical college educational support personnel employe" means a person who is a technical college district employe, but who is not a teacher.

"Every act and every portion of an act enacted by the legislature over the governor's partial veto which does not expressly prescribe the time when it takes effect shall take effect on the day after its date of publication as designated" by the secretary of state [the date of publication may not be more than 10 working days after the date of enactment].
