

## ENROLLED JOINT RESOLUTION

---

**Relating to:** recognizing the Council on Worker's Compensation as it celebrates its 30th anniversary.

Whereas, for 30 years the Council on Worker's Compensation has provided a forum for Wisconsin employers and employees to collaborate in recommending to the legislature changes in the Wisconsin worker's compensation law; and

Whereas, the wisdom of the Council on Worker's Compensation has helped to mold and refine the Wisconsin worker's compensation law as necessary to address emerging issues; and

Whereas, the guidance of the Council on Worker's Compensation has contributed to the stability of the Wisconsin worker's compensation program over the past 30 years and to the recognition that Wisconsin has the finest worker's compensation program in the nation; and

Whereas, the Council on Worker's Compensation and the legislature have enjoyed a cooperative working relationship and exchange of information for the past 30 years; and
