February 10, 1998 - Introduced by Representative KREIBICH, cosponsored by Senator C. POTTER. Referred to Committee on Colleges and Universities.

1 **AN ACT to amend** 39.30 (3m) (a) of the statutes; **relating to:** increasing the
2 maximum amount of tuition grants awarded by the higher educational aids
3 board.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the higher educational aids board administers a program that awards tuition grants to resident undergraduate students who are enrolled in this state at least half-time in an accredited, nonprofit higher educational institution or in a tribally controlled college. Students are eligible for grants not exceeding \$1,086 per semester or \$2,172 per academic year.

This bill increases these maximum grant amounts to \$1,150 per semester and \$2,300 per academic year.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

4 **SECTION 1.** 39.30 (3m) (a) of the statutes, as created by 1997 Wisconsin Act 27,

6 39.30 (**3m**) (a) No grant awarded under this section may exceed \$1,086 \$1,150
