1997 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 90

January 13, 1998 - Introduced by COMMITTEE ON RULES. Referred to Calendar.

1 **Relating to:** honoring Wisconsin Indian tribes.

2 Whereas, although 1998 is Wisconsin's sesquicentennial year, it is important
3 to remember that for centuries before Wisconsin became a state a vibrant culture,
4 that of the American Indians, flourished in the region that was to become this state;
5 and

6 Whereas, during the prestatehood era a number of tribes, including some that
7 are still represented in this state, made their home in the land that was to become
8 Wisconsin; and

9 Whereas, among the tribes that have lived in Wisconsin are the Ho Chunk, the
10 Chippewa, the Potawatomi, the Oneida, the Menominee, the Mohican-Munsee, the
11 Sauk, the Fox, the Sioux and the Ottawa; and

12 Whereas, the American Indian culture has persisted and has served as a model,
13 for example because of its reverence for nature and the value it places on family
14 relationships; and
